### **Select Accomplishments**

Initiated a focus on the student-athlete experience leading to significant increases in the academic performance of student-athletes. During the 2022-2023 academic year, UCR student-athletes attained an overall grade point average of 3.2.
- Provided leadership in developing and implementing the Student Affairs Strategic Plan 2025 which aligns with the University's strategic vision.
